#1	Determine if the Job Involves Lead-Based Paint	An overview of how the Certified Renovator does lead testing using EPA Recognized Test Kits.	
#2	Setting the Job Up Safely	Placing critical barriers and posting signs to isolate work area from access by unauthorized individuals to keep dust in the work area and non-workers out.	
#3	Protecting Yourself	Proper use of Personal Protective Equipment including suits/coveralls, eye protection, gloves, hard hats. Respirator use is covered in the Company's Respiratory Protection Plan.	
#4	Minimize the dust	Using the proper tools and procedures to minimize the spread of dust while performing work involving LBP.	
#5	Leave the Work Area Clean	Cleaning the work area so that it is completely free of dust and debris. Using proper tools and supplies and cleaning procedures.	
#6	Control the Waste	Using proper containerizing and disposal procedures for components containing Lead Paint or contaminated with LBP.	
#7	Verify Work Completion with the Cleaning Verification Procedure	The worker will be able to explain what the Cleaning Verification Procedure is and what to do if the procedure fails. The workers will know that only the Certified Renovator is the only person on the crew that can do this procedure.
